I first met Isabel in the cultural centre and Mecca of Aylsham that is the Friday Country Market, she came in and immediately her elegance and her style drew your eye to her. We bonded over marmalade, I made it and she bought it, she unstintingly supported the Market to the extent that any friend or relative who came to stay was steered, in the most charming way into it's ambit and was encouraged to buy before they even realised what they were doing!!

When the Country Market committee decided in their wisdom to hold a fashion show as a fundraiser we looked at each other in something akin to desperation and with one voice said Isabel and she came to help us without question or hesitation and was fantastic.

She was one of those very rare individuals who could inspire and really inspire, you felt you just wanted to help her to achieve whatever it was she wanted, you wanted to be in her orbit and her focus was always to help open up opportunities to those who would not have them.

It was Isabel's vision and drive that established the Aylsham Picture House, which became so much more than just a Town Hall showing films, it brought the community of Aylsham together, it helped to forge bonds and friendships. But for me wonderful though the Picture House is it was her passion to offer opportunities to the young people of Aylsham and to achieve this she used the full force of her amazing organisational abilities, determination to achieve her goal and of course her wonderful charm.

She got support and commitments from people before they even knew they had committed !!
